Meet Saint Rita

As mentioned in the bulletin, returning the tabernacle to its original position in the sanctuary has allowed for the repositioning of the saints' statues. Each now has its own "shrine" or area for devotion. At Immaculate Conception in Claflin, using the bare back walls of the church, has allowed us to keep all of our sacred art in use. It's also made possible the return of a former resident, Saint Rita. Long banished to a basement storeroom, she has been beautifully refurbished by Carol Herter.

Saint Rita was the patron of the Claflin Daughter of Isabella. They chose a good one, as familiarity with her story will show. Saint Rita was an Augustinian nun in 14th century Cascia, Italy. Because of her difficult life, she is a patron saint of impossible causes.

Already as a girl, Rita wanted to become a nun but her parents forced her to marry a man who proved to be violent, physically and emotionally abusive. She was married to him for eighteen years and bore him two sons. Over time, her patience with him did improve his behavior.

Italy at that time was cursed with civil war. Her husband was killed in the struggle. Her sons wanted to avenge his death, but Rita begged them to turn to peace instead. Both died of natural causes before they could turn to violence.

The widow then asked to join the convent, but she was denied. She persevered in prayer and was finally admitted. Her life was marked by fervor and prayer, and so was her body. One day, at prayer, her forehead was marked with stigmata, a wound of Christ inflicted by his crown of thorns. She enjoyed many mystical experiences before dying at age 70, on May 22nd, which is now her feast day.

She certainly did not have an easy life, but she continually turned to God in prayer. She is now a patron saint



of impossible causes, sterility, abuse victims, loneliness, marriage difficulties, parenthood, widows, the sick, and bodily ills and wounds. She is also one of the Church's incorruptible saints, her body venerated at the basilica named for her in Cascia, Italy.

The Catholic Company has a website on Saint Rita, where this "Prayer to Saint Rita" can also be found.

O Holy Patroness of those in need, St. Rita, whose pleadings before thy Divine Lord are almost irresistible, who for thy lavishness in granting favors hast been called the Advocate of the Hopeless and even of the Impossible; St. Rita, so humble, so pure, so mortified, so patient and of such compassionate love for thy Crucified Jesus that thou could obtain from Him whatsoever thou asks, on account of which all confidently have recourse to thee expecting, if not always relief, at least comfort; be propitious to our petition, showing thy power with God on behalf of thy suppliant; be lavish to us, as thou hast been in so many wonderful cases, for the greater glory of God, for the spreading of thine own

devotion, and for the consolation of those who trust in thee.

We promise, if our petition is granted, to glorify thee by making known thy favor, to bless and sing thy praises forever. Relying then upon thy merits and power before the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we pray thee grant that [here mention your request].

By the singular merits of thy childhood,

Obtain for us our request.

By thy perfect union with the Divine Will,

By thy heroic sufferings during thy married life,

By the consolation thou didst experience at the conversion of thy husband,

By the sacrifice of thy children rather than see them grievously offend God,

By the miraculous entrance into the convent,

By thy severe penances and thrice daily bloody scourging's,

By the suffering caused by the wound thou didst receive from the thorn of thy Crucified Savior,

By the Divine love which consumed thy heart,

By that remarkable devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, on which alone thou didst exist for four years,

By the happiness with which thou didst part from thy trials to join thy Divine Spouse,

By the perfect example thou gavest to people of every state of life.

Pray for us, O holy St. Rita, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Gerald was preceded in death by daughter Ashley and sister Pat Shields.

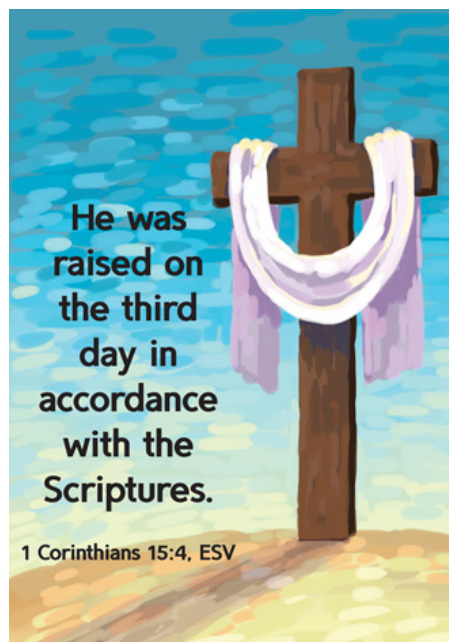

Several years ago Justin volunteered to coach St. Joseph School Basketball. He now coaches Ellinwood Middle School Basketball.

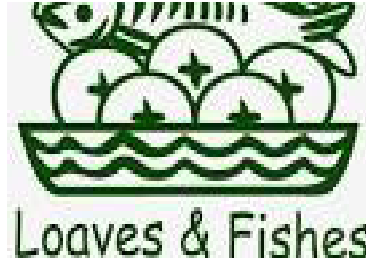
Justin and his wife Meredith have three children, Britton, Jocelynn and Jackson.

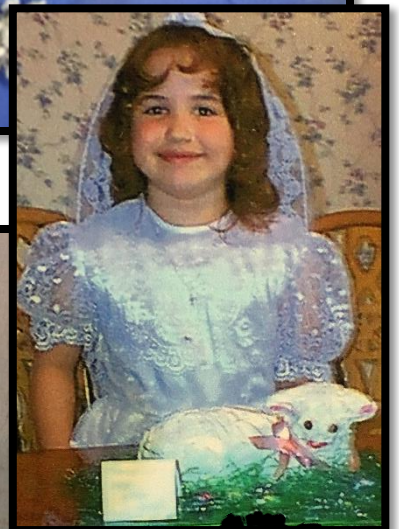
Time & Talent

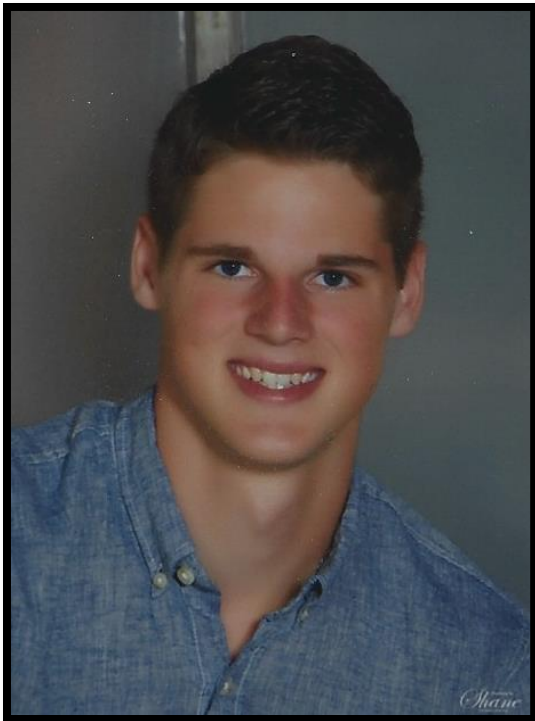


Baptism at Immaculate Conception

An Opportunity to Make a Difference

As we send our children off to college or out into the workforce, we often wonder if we have taught them everything that they need to know in order to be independent. Most young people that are transitioning to adulthood have a strong support network of family, friends or other people who are committed to helping them be successful.

The situation is vastly different for the approximate 25,000 foster youth that have been in the custody of the state prior to becoming an adult and “aging out”. In fact, many of them do not even own a car or even have a driver’s license since many foster homes have not taught them to drive or possibly don’t want to add them to their insurance. These young people often face the transition to adulthood with little or no support, and the outcomes are both sobering and shocking:

- Only 58% graduate high school
- Only 3% graduate college by the age of 25
- 1 in 5 are homeless after the age of 18
- 1 in 4 enter the justice system within 2 years
- 71% of females are pregnant by the age of 21

YOUTHRIVE plans to change these outcomes. YOUTHRIVE is a nonprofit organization, located in Kansas City, and is focused on empowering, equipping, and supporting foster youth as they transition to adulthood. Financial classes and a Matching Savings are two of the programs that the youth participate in as a part of the YOUTHRIVE “My Path” Program.

Youth are matched with Support Families or Support Individuals. After being in the foster care system, these youth are anxious to make some decisions for themselves, so this is a youth-directed program. Each young person is able to choose his or her own support family from a pool of candidates that match the preferences they have indicated as important. These Support Families or Support Individuals offer emotional support and may invite them into their homes for meals, to do laundry, watch a movie, etc. The youth does not live with the family or receive any monetary support from the family. Those needs are met through other sources.

Youthrive will be offering a training session as soon as enough families or individuals from Barton, Reno, Rice, or McPherson Counties show interest. After the training session, you can decide if you wish to proceed as a Support Family or Support Individual.

Requirements for Support Families/Individuals:

- 1 year commitment
- 4 hours total face to face time per month with the youth (split however works)
- 21 years of age or older
- At least 5 years difference in age
- Training Session
- Background check

ONLINE GIVING FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. What is Online Giving?

Online Giving is a direct payment program whereby your contribution is debited automatically from your checking, savings, or credit card account into your church's bank account.

2. What are the advantages of Online Giving?

It makes it easy to fulfill stewardship commitments, even when you can't attend church. You never have to bring cash or checks to church. Giving electronically also helps the church save money and improve its budget!

3. How are my contributions automatically deducted from my account?

Once you complete the online registration form, the contribution amount you specify will automatically be transferred from your bank account to the church's bank account.

4. When will my contribution be deducted from my account?

Your electronic contribution will be debited on the date you specify on the donation form.

5. If I do not write checks, how do I keep my checkbook balance straight?

Since your contribution is made at a pre-established time, you simply record it in your check register on the appropriate date. Electronic contributions are recorded for you on your bank statement as well as your online reports.

6. Without a canceled check, how can I prove I made my contribution?

Your bank statement gives you an itemized list of electronic transactions as well as your online reports.

7. Can I put different amounts in offerings and have all of them withdrawn at different times?

You can set up to contribute to different offerings at different times; HOWEVER you will have to do each one separately. You will receive a receipt for each one.

8. What if I change bank accounts?

Login and update your account information.

9. Is Online Giving risky?

It's less risky than writing checks or bringing cash to church. Electronic contributions cannot be lost, stolen or destroyed and have an extremely high rate of accuracy.

10. What if I try Online Giving and don't like it?

You can cancel your authorization by deleting your bank accounts and donation dates.

11. How do I sign up for Online Giving?

Complete the online registration form and select the donations and the amount you would like to donate along with your credit or debit card information. It's that easy!
